

Entry level courses are open to all students, with the completion of some classes being a prerequisite to train in further programs or advanced courses. 

WHO HOSTS THE CLASSES?

The Howard Fine Acting Studio has two bases of operation – one in LA and one in Melbourne. Uniquely, the two studios are serviced by one holistic faculty who take turns leading the courses at each location. For six months of the year, the Australian studio hosts a minimum of one of the LA-based faculty - guaranteeing The Studios share the same curriculum and level of expertise.

Full Time Program

The Full Time course curriculum has been refined to deliver excellence in the field of actor-training. Course components comprise of comprehensive acting technique, Scene Study, Personalisation, Speech and Singing for Actors, voice, and Alexander Technique, as well as on-camera and industry based components, all of which serve, explore and expand upon the core acting principles of The Studio.

This direct approach to the craft of acting allows for complexity and mastery as it progresses. Upon graduation, students are in possession of a rigorous technique designed to serve them throughout the rest of their career, and which continues to develop and refine as they work in the industry.

COURSE ENTRY REQUIREMENTS:

This course takes actors on an unprecedented, challenging, rigorous and at times, confronting journey. Accordingly, previous performance experience is required and admission is strictly by audition and interview. Applicants must be aged 18+ at the time the course commences.



SAMPLE CLASS

Free to attend, this two and a half hour class is a must for anyone thinking of training at The Studio. Hosted regularly throughout the year.

FOUNDATION, THE PROCESS AND OPEN ACCESS SCENE STUDY

Fast-paced, intensive introductions into the core acting principles of the Howard Fine Acting Studio. These courses ensure actors are equipped with a set of tools enabling them to create truthful life on stage and bring themselves fully to their work.

SCENE STUDY

Actors deepen their understanding of The Studio's award-winning approach to acting through weekly Scene Study classes. These technique-driven classes further refine the core acting principles championed by The Studio. Students are allocated a scene partner and play, which, under the guidance of the course tutor are used to explore issues of process and technique.

UTA HAGEN: OBJECT EXERCISES

In this class, students undertake a number of Hagen's famous Object Exercises. These exercises help students to overcome performance challenges, such as creating truthful physical life on stage, issues of self-consciousness, remaining present, and recreating physical sensations.

SPEECH AND SINGING FOR ACTORS (SFA)

David Coury's unique SFA program responds to the needs for actors to have a strong and powerful connection to their unique emotional sources, and uses vocal exercises to develop their ability to be emotionally present in performance.

ALEXANDER TECHNIQUE

Through the Alexander program, students will learn to connect to their body, discover stillness, presence, improve breath coordination, free impulse and allow spontaneity.

PERSONALISATION

Accessing real emotion and living truthfully in an imaginary set of circumstances is often a challenge for actors. At the Howard Fine Acting Studio, we have designed a series of progressive exercises that seek to address these issues.

PLAYING THE BARD: SHAKESPEARE

Led by the award-winning Sally McLean (founder of Shakespeare Republic), this program provides actors with the tools to excel at performing Shakespeare.

WORKING WITH THE PROS

During this series of programs actors have the opportunity to work first-hand with current industry professionals.

SOLO PERFORMANCE

Direct from New York, Karen Ludwig leads her astonishing Solo Performance class. If you are looking to create your own work, make opportunities for yourself or develop as an artist then look no further than this class.

IMPROVISATION

Led by one of Australia's leading improvisers, this program helps free the actor and allows them to live spontaneously and authentically.

APPLICATION OF TECHNIQUE TO SCREEN

Led by the award-winning Shane Connor, this program provides actors with the opportunity to explore the application of technique to their work on screen.


AMERICAN ACCENT

Intent progresses, it does not diminish. As people, when we don't get what we want from a person or situation, we up the voltage of our actions. In the pursuit of our goals we employ everything that is available to us - empathy, charm, manipulation, anger, love etc - this is true of any character you will play.

Play and film scripts are centred on exceptional days in the lives of their characters. No writer wrote about regular days or events. Therefore, be wary of getting 'comfortable' with a scene. Characters are always in the unknown - they are at crossroads, at moments of critical decision and in crisis.

Do not be humiliated by making mistakes, this will inhibit your growth and you risk never truly creating.

Your job as an actor is to justify a character and their actions, not judge them. It takes no talent to judge a character.

To begin personalising your character ask yourself - what in the human condition is this about and where does it live in me?
